“Drug driving” is a more common problem than drink driving, according to a poll of 17,500 AA members. More than 50,000 drivers would fail roadside “drugalyzer” tests, according to a British company that has been conducting global trials. Research from Trimega Laboratories shows the device detects drug impairment in roughly half the number of drivers who fail breathalyzers, which the Home Office puts at more than 100,000 per year for England and Wales.
